

Editorial guidelines for IPRax-authors

Dear IPRax-Author,

We kindly ask you to consider the following instructions while writing your manuscript. Following the guidelines will accelerate publishing your article. Please hand in your manuscript electronically via e-mail to: IPRax@uni-koeln.de.

I. Instructions concerning formatting:

Footnotes should generally be placed at the end of a sentence or at the end of a clause. The number follows any punctuation mark other than the dash (e.g.:...problem,¹ which...). However when the footnote refers to a specific word the number follows the word. A footnote in the heading is always an asterisk footnote (*). The footnotes in the continuous text always begin with the numeral 1.

II. Heading and structure (Example):

Heading (fat and centred)

by *given name/family name*, workplace*

If it is a review of a judgement please add following subheading after the heading
(at the court, 1.9.2006 – reference number)

* Degree, LL.M (place)

II. Heading

III. General instructions:

Heading: Every article, even judgement reviews, receive a heading and structure headings.

Italic type: Every technical term (even commonly used terms, e.g. *lex fori*); every given or family name should be italic, please (this does not apply for the footnotes).

Dates: Please don't write 01.02.2005, but 1.1.2005. Always use the numeral format, please (e.g. 1.11.2005 and not 1st of November 2005)

Abbreviations: Please use as few abbreviations as possible. If you use them, please write them out when you use them for the first time.

Article 1 Section 2 letter a becomes: Art. 1 sec. 2 lit. a
